Then, enjoy 5 full hours exploring the churches, canals and lace shops of Bruges on your own. See the Begijnhof, the city gates and the eye-catching windmills. And indulge in some delicious Belgian chocolates on your ride back to Amsterdam!









The cobbled lanes and canals linking the market squares are so picture perfect that you may find it difficult to put your camera away and absorb the beauty for yourself. The city is also an architecture lover's dream, even by European standards and the Gothic and Baroque buildings are truly jaw-dropping.







The Markt, the "nerve center" of Bruges. And you can see why: Shadowed by medieval buildings, the area is peppered with cafés that spill out into the streets.

Horse-drawn carriages also clip-clop through the city square. You'll find it right in the heart of Bruges, within a five or sixminute walk from the Church of Our Lady and the Groeninge Museum.



Brugse Vrije: This building was once the administerial centre of Bruges when it was in its Liberty of Bruges phase in the 12th Century and is still used as offices to this day.

The building itself is stunning to look upon and the carved chimney, from the 15th Century, is arguably its most beautiful asset.

Also worth seeing is the mantlepiece

ornament, made from oak, depicting Charles V and his two grandfathers.



Church of Our Lady: Completed in the 15th century, the construction of this church took two centuries to construct, and the result is a soaring 381-foot brick spire (the largest in the world) that can be seen for miles.

And there's another artistic treasure inside: Michelangelo's "Madonna and Child" sculpture.



There are also tombs and a couple of mausoleums that are worth seeing. And just to clear any confusion, the church's name -- Onze-Lieve-Vrouwekerk -- translates into Church of Our Lady.






For its size Bruges contains an inordinate amount of art galleries and museums, from local art to collections dedicated to the likes Of Salvador Dali and Picasso.

The Groeninge Museum, Bruge's museum of fine arts, hosts a number of works by the famous 15th-century Flemish painters Jan van Eyck and Hans Memling. But that's not all: Works from the Flemish Primitives, as well as from the Modernists, also adorn the walls. Of special note is Hieronymus Bosch's "The Last Judgment" and Jan van Eyck's "Madonna with Canon van der Paele."

Although this point can be applied to anywhere in Belgium, Bruges is a really a showcase city for two of Belgium's main treats, beer and chocolate.



Sukerbuyc is a family run chocolatier and cafe which is a great spot to taste some of the best chocolate in the city/country/world. Order yourself a hot drink and you can expect it to come with some of the divine chocolate made at the cafe.





Bruges once contained dozens of breweries, but now De Halve Maan is the last one standing.

With a history that dates back to the 16th century, the

brewery has been continuously operating at its current site since 1856.





Today, visitors can tour the historic facility, get some great photos from its tower and sample the beer.

There is a dark and blonde

version and visitors are treated to a glass of the latter at the end of the 45-minute tour.





In medieval times, the Belfry and Market Halls (translated from *Belfort en Hallen*) was a bustling marketplace presided over by a soaring gothic bell tower. Today, the echoing chimes of the carillon bells can still be heard throughout Bruges. And you can also climb the tower's 366 steps for a sweeping view of Bruges.






The Frietmuseum claims to be the world's first and only museum dedicated to Belgian potato fries (frites).

On the first floor, you can learn about Belgium's history with this beloved snack; on the ground floor, the museum traces the potato's roots from Peru; and in the basement you can sample some tasty potato fries.

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The Romanesque-style Basilica of the Holy Blood curiously has an ornate Gothic upper level. But most visitors flock to this chapel to look at a small vial of blood, which is said to have belonged to none-other than Jesus Christ. Every year on Ascension Day (in May or June), the bishop of Bruges accompanies the holy relic through the city streets in the Procession of the Holy Blood.





Choco-Story: This museum is all about chocolate: its history, its recipes and more. In fact, Choco-Story's mission statement is: "To make known the story of the transformation of cocoa into chocolate and to promote the health and quality aspects of Belgian chocolate."

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Still, if you wouldn't call yourself a chocolate connoisseur, you might skip the museum and instead head to one of Bruges' celebrated chocolate shops.

If you really love great chocolate, and you want to participate in a "How To Interactive Class" we



can arrange a private celebrity tour where you will learn from the owners and create some chocolate of your own.

A very agreeable half an hour should be spent

travelling the cities arteries where secret gardens, picturesque bridges and crumbly old houses look even more beautiful when viewed from the water. Bruges has a mild maritime climate and summer is warm without being unpleasantly hot, perfect conditions for the canal tour.



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Relax in the Beguinage: This is a little haven of tranquility where swans gather on the banks of the canal and people relax in the pretty restaurants and bars that line the perimeter.

The Beguinage became popular in Flemish kingdom of the 14th century and were semimonastic dwellings for women, where the way of life was similar to that of a convent, but the women never took oaths.





This isn't your ordinary hospital, **the Museum St Janshospital** is a restored 12th century hospital, complete with timber roof beams and art masterpieces dating back to the 15th Century.

The oak reliquary, in all of its gilded glory, is the most famous piece within the museum and was crafted by Hans Memling.

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The piece tells the story of St Ursula's betrothal to a pagan prince. Ursula, along with 11,000 virgins, was murdered on her way to Rome by the King of the Huns.

Bruge's Stadhuis, town-hall, is a truly stunning building that dates back to the early 15th Century.



The turrets and slitted windows on the buildings facade ooze Gothic beauty.

There are also a number of statues of former counts and countesses of Flanders.



Audio guides lead visitors through the interior starting with the portraits in the hallway before heading upstairs to the Gothic hall. If you thought the building looked good from the outside wait until you see the ceiling and the murals within the Gothic hall, you will be left speechless.







See Bruge's Other Square

The Burg square, right next to the better know but arguably less impressive Markt square, is worth a visit during your time in the city. The palace in the square was the seat of the Count of Flanders for many years.



The square was also the site of a magnificent cathedral but this was tore down in the 18th Century.

The Burg is probably the best place in Bruges for lovers of architecture as the collection of buildings dotted around this square are all beautiful in their own way.



Jeruzalemkerk: This church in St Anna is one of the strangest in the city.

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It was built by the Adornes family in the 15th Century and was based upon the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem.



The altarpiece of the church is covered in skulls and there is also an effigy of Jesus Christ's corpse and a tomb containing only the heart of Anselm Adornes which was supposedly bought all the way back from Scotland following Adornes murder. It is safe to say that this church is one of the more macabre in the city of Bruges.





Kasteel Van Loppem or, in English, Castle Loppem is a good opportunity to explore the area just outside of Bruges. The building, which is just on the outskirts of the city, is more of a mansion than a castle.



It was built in the 19th Century and was home of the Belgian King for a short period of time after the end of the First World War.

During this time it was also a command center for Belgium's army. The park surrounding the castle are

wonderful and home to a maze and ponds.

Go beyond Amsterdam with a half-day tour of two important Dutch cities: Delft and The Hague. Admire the Netherlands' famous Delft blue-and-white pottery on a tour of the Royal Delft, followed by free time to explore Delft's historic city center.

During this tour you will visit two cities which have both played a crucial role in the history of the Netherlands: The Hague and Delft. You will see some of the highlights of these cities.

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Royal the Hague and Delft

We start with a visit to Delft and walk through the old center along canals and historic almshouses. Visit The Royal Dutch Delftware factory "De Porceleyne Fles". The factory was established in 1653 and is the last remaining Delftware factory from the 17th century. The world famous Royal Delftware is still entirely hand-painted according to a centuries old tradition.





Delft Blue Tile painting workshop – Unique VIP Exclusive Experience

Combine a guided tour of the Royal Delft Blue museum and factory with an inspiring and creative workshop. Paint your own Delft Blue tile, under the guidance of a professional painter. With paint brushes and Delft Blue paint you create a wonderful souvenir and have a unique experience. You can do this by using stencils (patterns) or you can make your own design.

Workshops can be arranged in the morning between 9am and 2pm on weekdays. In weekends the workshop starts at 2.30pm. This program includes a visit to the factory and museum, the painting workshop and coffee or tea with something sweet. It takes 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours total.

The pieces cannot be taken home immediately as they need to be glazed and finished off in the oven first. After 5 days the pieces can be collected or sent to your address. The postage costs will be charged separately and are not included in the costs of the workshop.

Lunch on your own en-route. (TBD with guide on site – Additional payment at time of service with restaurant).

Then take a sightseeing tour of The Hague, one of the Netherlands most important cities. The seat of the Dutch Parliament, whose sights include the Binnenhof complex, the Parliament buildings, Noordeinde Palace and the Peace Palace, home to the International Court of Justice.

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Your guide will provide insightful commentary throughout the afternoon. The Hague, on a half-day trip from Amsterdam. Home to the Dutch government, foreign embassies and many important international organizations,



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The Hague features both historic sites such as the Binnenhof, and iconic modern institutions including the Peace Palace and International Court of Justice. Your guide



explains the importance of these places as you take in the handsome city center.



Proceed from The Hague for a visit to the miniature village of **Madurodam**. Finish the day with a visit to the Madurodam, an outdoor park with detailed replicas of the most famous sights in the Netherlands.
