# 7 -10 Day Itinerary: Argentina: Mendoza & Santiago

## Day 1 Arrival Argentina: Mendoza

Once there, you will meet your private English-speaking driver who will handle your luggage and transfer you to your hotel.

Mendoza is the center of Argentina's wine industry and is recognized as the country's best grape growing region accounting for approximately 70% of the country's total output. Santiago del Estero is a province in northern <u>Argentina</u>, consisting mainly of pampa, flat grasslands and desert. The region has a large indigenous population and the city itself is the oldest in Argentina.



#### Expect hot weather and relaxed people

Expect a hot Santiago mostly because it has a sub-tropical climate. The best time to visit the city is undoubtedly winter because the weather is warm and pleasant then. There aren't numerous attractions in Santiago but nevertheless, it is worth a visit. No architectural heritage has survived since its founding in 1553 by, as expected, the Spanish settlers, but it is a lovely place to visit. Also known as the "Madre de Ciudades" (Mother of Cities), Santiago is renowned for its folk music, like *zamba* and *chacarera*, and the tendency of its locals to choose relaxation over work. And who can blame them? There's such a nonchalant ambience in Santiago del Estero.

**The afternoon.** you will be joined by your professional local guide and you all will continue on with private Santiago City tour. You will visit many of the most important sites in the city and hear historical and informative facts about these sites and the city, as well. After the tour you will be returned to your hotel.

Day 5 Argentina: Santiago

#### Breakfast at the hotel.

**After Breakfast,** meet your private English-speaking driver & professional local guide in the lobby of your hotel for your morning tour. (Bring your bathing suits today)

Today you will visit the Centro Cultural del Bicentenario. This cultural center is one of the most important cultural complexes in Argentina, and houses three museums that are formed of the historic town hall, which was declared a Provincial Historic Monument in 1987.

The town hall was renovated and expanded to create the cultural center, which contains the "Dr. Orestes Di Lullo" History Museum, the "Ramón Gómez Cornet" Fine Arts Museum and the Museo de Ciencias Antropológicas y Naturales "Emilio y Duncan Wagner" Museum of Natural and Anthropological Sciences.



The center also has exhibition and events spaces which host concerts, cinematic festivals and theater performances.

**Lunch is on your own today.** Your guide will make recommendations for dinign in the area. You can also see Celebration Escapes' Restaurant Collection for recommendations for dining in Santiago.

**After lunch,** you will continue on your tour to the Rio Dulce, where you will experience the Rio Hondo Thermal Baths.

Located on the banks of the Rio Dulce are the Rio Hondo thermal baths, housed in a luxurious hotel that takes full advantage of the site of Argentina's most thermally-active city. This thermal resort lets guests try out the mineral-rich waters of the baths, which are said to re-energise and reinvigorate the body, mind and soul.

The baths are to be found on the banks of the Dulce River and have their origin in the natural groundwater layers. Santiago is considered to be the biggest thermal city in the country due to these baths, so visiting them is a must

**After the thermal bath** experience, you will be returned to your hotel. You will be at leisure for the remainder of the day.

**This evening, Dinner** is on your own you will have a reservation at a restaurant near the Centro Cultural del Bicentenario. Meet your private driver in the lobby of the hotel to transfer you to the restaurant.

**After dinner**, take a short walk to the Centro Cultural del Bicentenario where you will experience a wonderful performance at the concert hall or theater. (performances will depend on the dates of your trip).

After the performance, your private driver will meet you outside of the theater for your transfer back to the hotel.

Today you have an option of a day at leisure to explore on your own or relax, or an active day exploring with a private guide, the Copo National Park (\*\*HINT – there is a spa at the park and other less active things to do – it's well worth a visit)

After Breakfast (if you have selected the national park option), meet your private English-speaking driver & professional local guide in the lobby of your hotel for a tour of the Copo national Park.

Another must-see attraction in Santiago is the Copo National Park. This natural reservation covers 282,300 acres of the Dry Chaco Region and is home to numerous flora and fauna species quite hard to find in other places of the world.

The park is situated about 187 miles from Santiago and it's a great place to spot the beautiful Red Quebracho, a beautiful noble tree, as well as the South American jaguar, the skunk pig, and the giant armadillo.

Nature lovers should definitely plan a trip to the Copo National Park, especially if they visit Santiago between April and November.

You will have a picnic in the park for lunch and relax at your leisure for awhile.

You will be able to select the activities that you would like to experience and your guide will assist you with guiding or getting you to the right place within the park for your activity. Regardless, your guide will be with you every step of the way to make sure your day is efficient and exciting.

# **Club Tapiz Hotel and Zolo House**



Club Tapiz is among Mendoza's most charming bodega-style hotels. Built in 1890 and surrounded by 10 hectares of vineyards, the house was restored to preserve its Renaissance-style villa structure and emblematic elements, such as the patio and pinewood floors.

Its connection to the outdoors and the views of the Andean Range are amazing. A few steps



away from the house is an antique winery where the "pulpería" (traditional bar) invites guest to taste exclusive wines. The four-bedroom villa Zolo House also sits adjacent to the main building.
